POTENTIAL ICD-10 DELAY

The acting head of the CMS on Tuesday signaled that the agency will extend the timeline on ICD-10 implementation.

Marilyn Tavenner, acting administrator of the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS), spoke at the AMA's National Advocacy Conference. She didn't say specifically that the ICD-10 start date would be pushed back, but said that CMS would create a working group with physicians to guide the implementation of the update.

She also told reporters that CMS would issue a notice of proposed rulemaking on the ICD-10 issue in a few days.
