## THE NATIONAL CHILDREN'S STUDY/DAVIDSON COUNTY

*Message from Rashonda Lewis, JD, MHA, Vanderbilt University*

We are excited to announce that the National Children's Study is underway in Davidson County.

We would like to encourage you and your practice to become actively involved if you have not already done so.

Sponsored by the National Institutes of Health, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, and the Environmental Protection Agency, this is the first large-scale observational study aimed at understanding effects of genetics and the environment on children's health and development in the United States.

This landmark study will eventually follow 100,000 children from the time their mothers are pregnant until age 21.

Davidson County is one of 105 recruitment sites across the country. Local recruitment efforts will be led by Davidson County Partners, a collaboration that includes Vanderbilt University, Meharry Medical College, Metro Nashville Public Health Department, and Tennessee Maternal Fetal Medicine.
